

2014 JURY



Sara Vega Miche is a writer and expert on Cuban cinema. Since 2003 she has been a member of the Steering Committee of the Young Filmmakers Showcase of the Instituto Cubano del Arte e Industria Cinematográficos (ICAIC) in Havana. She is also a curator and researcher at the Cuba Film Archive. Her writings have been published in several books about Cuban cinema, including, Coordenadas del cine cubano I y II, Carteles de cine cubano I, Carteles cubanos de cine, Imágenes de Cine: Eduardo Muñoz Bachs, Testimonios del diseño gráfico cubano 1959-1974, Encyclopedia of Cuba, Soy Cuba, and in cultural magazines such as Cuba Update, AGR and Cine Cubano. She co-wrote the documentary film Poética gráfica insular (2007). She has lectured on Cuban cinema and Cuban film posters, curated poster exhibitions around the world and published three books on Cuban film posters: La otra imagen del cine cubano, Ciudadano cartel, and Carteles son... carteles del ICAIC.



Mónica Savirón has worked as a film writer, editor, and programmer. For 10 years she directed a weekly radio show on documentary and experimental films in Madrid and her essays have been published internationally.

In New York, she has worked on the legacy of experimental filmmaker Beryl Sokoloff; with preservationist and artist Bill Brand; and as creative associate, archival researcher, and assistant editor of the Amsterdam International Documentary Film Festival, IDFA, Grand Prize film, *First Cousin Once Removed* (2012). Her video *To Begin With* (2012) had its World Premiere at Experiments in Cinema Festival in Albuquerque, NM. Her film *Broken Tongue* (2013), a tribute to avant-garde poet Tracie Morris, had its World Premiere at the 52nd Ann Arbor Film Festival. Her work explores the cinematic possibilities of sound and avant-garde poetics.




Chaim Litewski was born in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and has been making films since his adolescence. He received his undergraduate and master's degree in London from the Polytechnic of Central London/Westminster University. His academic work dealt primarily with conflict and film propaganda. His articles appeared in Sight and Sound, Screen, Image International and various other publications.

He has produced films for the British Film Institute's Production Board, Channel Four, NBC, RAI (Italy) and many other international broadcasters. He was a news correspondent with Brazil's Globo Television in London and an international news coordinator with Globo Television in Rio de Janeiro. Later he became the head of a public radio and television station in northeastern Brazil. In 1991, Chaim joined United Nations Television in New York as a TV Producer, covering conflicts, humanitarian emergencies, and human rights stories in over 100 countries and

producing dozens of news items, feature stories and documentaries. He has covered the Rwanda genocide, the South Asia tsunami, an earthquake in Pakistan, and wars in Central America, the Caucasus region, Central Asia, South Pacific, the Middle East and Africa.

He currently heads the United Nations Television Section. Chaim has participated in seminars, lectures and discussions about the role of media in modern society and organized various UN film festivals worldwide. He also produced and directed "Citizen Boilesen", a feature documentary on the relationship between big business and paramilitary death squads in Brazil during the height of the country's military dictatorship. Chaim is serving as a juror in his personal capacity as a filmmaker.

Franco's Settlers explores the legacy of Spanish dictator Francisco Franco through the eyes of residents who lived in one of the model villages founded during his time in power. Franco ruled from 1939 to 1975 and, as the film reveals, remains a controversial and influential figure in Spain today. In researching the model villages, filmmakers Palacios and Post uncovered a piece of history that was obscure even to those deeply knowledgeable about Franco. The film was handled gingerly in Spain when it screened last year, according to Spanish press reports. Attempts to stop the film from showing in Spain were unsuccessful, but one festival toned down its publicity by removing film posters featuring satirical images of the dictator.



Please join us for a panel discussion with Merel Juliá, the widow of Puerto Rican actor Raúl Juliá, actors Armand Assante and Julie Carmen, stars of The Penitent and other special guests, about Juliá's legacy, the making of The Penitent, and Los Hermanos Penitentes of New Mexico.







Raúl Juliá was one of the most respected actors of his generation and well-known for his humanitarian work. His diverse acting career included stage, film and television and he won numerous awards, including four Golden Globes and awards for human rights work. His films include Kiss of the Spider Woman, The Burning Season, Romero, and The Penitent. Throughout his career, Juliá helped emerging actors and screenwriters, supported Puerto-Rican and Latino artistic and cultural endeavors and worked together with Merel in the Hunger Project, an anti-hunger charity. Although his life was cut short at the age of 54, he leaves a legacy most do not equal. Merel, a former dancer, and Raul were married in 1976 and have two sons, Raul Sigmund and Benjamin Rafael.

A screening of **The Penitent** will follow the discussion during a week that marks the 20th anniversary of Juliá's death.

Desde Cuba: New Cinema features award winning short films from the 2014 Young Filmmakers Showcase in Havana, Cuba, a prestigious, annual competition in Cuba for filmmakers younger than 35. With few exceptions, the winning shorts from the competition premiere in the U.S. each year at the NEFIAC festival.

Juan Pablo Daranas, born in 1991, was involved in two films that won awards for fiction in this year's Havana competition. He co-wrote and edited the short drama The Premiere / El estreno, directed by Ana Alpízar, about the relationship between an aspiring actress and her protective mother. And he wrote and produced Yunaisy a drama about a documentary filmmaker in Cuba facing censorship for the first time.



Sofia falls for a local drug dealer who wants to take her to Miami but she soon finds a better prospect after meeting a well-connected drug lord and his wife. Her love has consequences for all involved.

Dangerous Loves is a cross section of daily life in a city corrupted by the drug trade. In 1989 alone, 300 bombs were set off in Cali. It is a history that remains timely as images of the extravagant world of drug dealers remains alive and well in the minds of Cali's youth.
